You are invited to submit an abstract for a breakout session to be presented during the 2022 Huether Lasallian Conference that will address the conference theme:

Together and By Association: Responding to the Signs of the Times

WHAT WE ARE LOOKING FOR

The 2022 Huether planning committee is accepting abstracts for breakout session presentations of 75 minutes in length that will take place during concurrent sessions in the afternoon on Friday, November 18 and in the morning on Saturday, November 19. Presentations should focus on how Lasallian communities and ministries are addressing the theme, "Together and By Association: Responding to the Signs of the Times."

Breakout session presentations will share the best practices from our ministries that respond to the signs of the times in our educational communities. As society continues to grapple with many significant challenges, such as attending to mental health needs, responding to increasing acts of violence and mass shootings, creating a racially just world and navigating the disruptions of COVID-19, so, too, do our inclusive Lasallian educational communities. This year, the Huether Lasallian Conference will focus on building up our communities and how we are responding to these challenges while also ensuring that we are meeting the needs of the young people entrusted to our care. The planning committee has surfaced the following as possible topics for the breakout sessions:

- Programs or best practices that promote and highlight inclusive communities and respect for all persons within the Lasallian educational community
- Programs or best practices that highlight the sense of belonging within the Lasallian educational community

- Relationship/Community building in a Lasallian Community (building up Lasallian community through my vocation and work)
- Lasallian Charism in the Classroom/Workplace
 - How are De La Salle's teachings experienced in a core content classroom?
 - How are De La Salle's teachings experienced in counseling or office settings?
- Programs or best practices that address the mental health needs of the community (students, clients, staff)
- Programs or best practices that address the spiritual needs of the community (students, clients, staff)
- Programs or best practices learned throughout the COVID-19 pandemic

During each breakout session, the presenter(s) should focus on how we look at the present and to the future in light of the topic(s).

3. Intended audience (A-all educators; E-elementary school faculty and staff; M-middle school faculty and staff; H-high school faculty and staff; C-college/university faculty and staff; YFS-youth and family services)
4. Objectives/intended outcomes for participants
5. Program abstract (no more than 200 words)
6. A/V needs (LCD projector, screen, lectern and internet for presenter will be provided; **presenter must provide own laptop**)

NOTE: If you are using a Mac computer, please bring the appropriate adapter.
7. Willingness to repeat session

NOTE: You will be notified by email of acceptance of your presentation. Accepted presenters (limited to two per session) will receive a \$100 reduction of the 2022 Huether Lasallian Conference registration fee. **All accepted presenters must be registered and paid in full by Friday, October 26, 2022, in order to present.**
